toe-tapping, *Fridley City Band* music. It was a joyous, proud, rewarding celebration.

Interpretive Center - Wow!

First you see butterfly garden ponds, then an exceptionally attractive building set in the forest, and finally, an inviting entrance.

Clever internal spaces provide efficient group management. Four large multipurpose rooms with stunning



outside views come outfitted with the latest A/V technology near a catering kitchen. Exhibit space is filled with unique, educational, hands-on natural environment exhibits. Wow!

Cool Exhibits

Several unique, cool exhibits are original designs (Crawl-through Soil Cube, Interactive Tree, Phenology, Springbrook Is Sustainable, Wetland




Habitat Sculpture, Puppet Theater).
Some exhibits are new, spiffier versions of old exhibits (Touch and Feel Play Stations, Fridley Tornado Touchscreen Kiosk, Terrarium Wall, Aquarium Wall). All exhibits provide superb learning experiences. While viewing exhibits, look

through the large expanse of glass to enjoy nature (turkeys, deer, squirrels, birds, forest, etc.).

SPRING Project Overview

Over a decade, a dedicated group worked to implement the SPRING (Sanctuary Protection and Renewal Into the Next Generation) Project to revitalize the park's 7 acre gateway area with these goals:

- 1) Provide greatly improved environmental education programs
- 2) Provide enhanced outdoor experiences for all visitors
- 3) Continue to protect the park's fragile, diversified ecosystem
- 4) Create attractive spaces to host weddings and community events These goals were achieved with a new Interpretive Center, new Exhibits (photo below), and many Outdoor Amenities. We were aided greatly with a \$5 million grant from the State of Minnesota. We are only 15% short of our additional funding goal (\$2.5 million) to complete the pro-







Phase 2 Part 2 Coming

Phase 1 of the SPRING Project (new Interpretive Center) is complete.

Phase 2 Part 1 (paver walkway, much landscaping and some outdoor site amenities) is complete.


Phase 2 Part 2 (nature-based play area, amphitheater and infrastructure) is scheduled for mid 2017 completion (see graphic). The planned new pavilion is waiting for sponsorship funding - a great major gift opportunity.



Sustainability - YES!

The new Interpretive Center incorporates several major sus-

tainability (minimizing environmental impacts) features including: geothermal heating and air con-



ditioning, porous hardscapes (paving), green roof, recycled construction materials, efficient LED lighting, bird-safe windows (right photo), butterfly garden holding ponds and a zero waste program. One exhibit (left photo) demonstrates the energy needed for three different lighting technologies.
